# **Water Quality Articles**

<u>Scott County finds preserving farmland a tough row to hoe</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). After its latest long-range plan drew fire, the County Board is weighing how best to protect farmers while not stifling development.

<u>8 appointed to outdoors council</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). Eight of 12 people who will serve on a legislative-citizens council and recommend how to spend money on fish and wildlife habitat raised by the recently passed constitutional amendment have been appointed.

<u>U researchers try to make fuel from</u> (Minnesota Daily). With the country's energy outlook still undecided, a team of researchers at the University of Minnesota is leading the investigation of a promising new source of biofuels.

<u>Panel's OK won't quell Eyota ethanol plant dispute</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). A state board voted 8-0 to allow MinnErgy to get air and water quality permits, but residents of the nearby city of Eyota are planning the next step in their effort to stop it.

<u>The new neighbors are real turkeys</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). With Thanksgiving here, the birds are aplenty throughout southern Minnesota. Wild ones, that is.

<u>Local program keeps millions of plastic bags out of the dump</u> (KARE TV). <u>It's in the Bag</u> creates jobs for adults with disabilities, while recycling millions of pounds of plastic. "This is what you get when you work at Merrick," a Merrick client named Terry said while showing off his biceps.

Wolves, elk destroy Minnesota farmers' animals, property (Grand Forks Herald). Last year, Joe Wilebski's cattle were attacked by timber wolves. He has graphic photographs of maimed and devoured calves as evidence.

<u>VeraSun bankruptcy hitting Minnesota farmers in the wallet</u> (Minnesota Public Radio). The collapse of VeraSun Energy is costing hundreds of Minnesota farmers millions of dollars. The Sioux Falls ethanol company filed for bankruptcy three weeks ago after losing almost \$500 million since last summer. Now the company said it will terminate many of the corn contracts it signed with farmers. That's taking revenue away from farms as falling corn prices hurt their ability to make up for lost income.

South Dakota unanimously approves Big Stone II air permit (Hutchinson Leader). A Prevention of Significant Deterioration permit was unanimously approved Thursday, Nov. 20, for the proposed \$1.8 billion, 500-megawatt Big Stone II power plant. The decision by the South Dakota Board of Minerals and Environment came at a meeting in Pierre.

<u>Cheap gas is a relief – but a terrible trend if it lures us back to old habits</u> (MinnPost). I paid under \$2 a gallon this week at my neighborhood gas station, a welcome relief from the \$4 price of a few months past. Cheap gasoline is back. But is that truly a good thing?

<u>Sealcoating parking lots, driveways could be harming Minnesota's urban lakes</u> (Kare 11 News). Any vigilant homeowner will tell you it's part of their routine. But sealcoating that driveway or parking lot against 4-season frost/thaw damage may also be harming nearby lakes, rivers, and watersheds.

<u>Breaking down the benefits of locally-produced food</u> (Marshall Independent). Ken Meter sees a lot of opportunities for local farmers in producing food.

<u>A GOOD EGG</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). Grocery shoppers are often bombarded with confusing egg carton claims, including "cage free," "free range" and "pastured." Does the degree to which a hen is confined affect the quality of its eggs -- and our health?

<u>Newly appointed outdoors council to meet Monday</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). The council members will recommend how money raised by the wildlife habitat amendment should be spent.

<u>Potential rules changes worrying some environmentalists</u> (Minneapolis Star Tribune). Administration's plans to relax regulations raise alarms among Minnesota environmentalists.

A troubled urban habitat in the shadow of the MOA (Minneapolis Star Tribune). Ducks aren't thriving in wildlife refuge waters in the shadow of the Mall of America. No one is quite sure why.
