Eric Sevareid and Walter Port paddled the entire length of the Minnesota River on the way to Hudson Bay in the summer of 1930 for a total of 2,250 miles. These two teenagers pushed themselves and their canoe over sixty portages in fourteen weeks or 98 days arriving at the York Factory at the end of September. The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency recently issued a 10-year permit for the Ponderosa Sanitary Landfill in Blue Earth County. The permit issuance follows a public comment period on the permit and an environmental review of the landfill's planned expansion. The agency found that the expansion, as proposed, will have no potential for significant environmental effects.
